### Congratulations to everyone for another successful Match!

Our Wayne State University Programs were able to recruit outstanding residents for the upcoming 2016-2017 academic year. This is definitely a testament to the quality of programs and the fantastic teams of staff, residents, and faculty at each program.

For the first year, we conducted a survey through ERAS to all candidates that interviewed with our WSU programs. We received 96 responses. Overall, candidates had very positive impressions from the interview process. They valued the interaction with residents, the perception of “positive learning environment and happiness” influenced greatly their decision. Much appreciated was dinner only with residents prior to the interview date. Their impression was completed by one-on-one interviews with program directors and faculty. Skype interviews for some transitional year candidates was accepted very favorably. The biggest impact on decision-making was location (some had negative impression from Detroit, others raved about Rochester); WSU reputation and the perception of “resident happiness and satisfaction” within the program. Some candidates mentioned that a follow-up communication from the program director or faculty would have been welcomed.



In addition to obtaining this valuable candidates input regarding the interview process, we also employed the holistic review principles in this years recruitment. Broad screening criteria were applied, including a balance of experience, attributes, and academic metrics. The selection committees drew upon diversity of cultures, ideas, and perspective to provide optimal learning environment for all learners.

The next few months will be busy with onboarding and orientation processes. The GME office is grateful to the program coordinators for working with us and HR on the numerous requirements, documents, and logistics of the onboarding process.

## ACGME News

This data can be obtained in a Excel spreadsheet or in a delimited file format accessible when logged into the program or ADS account (<https://apps.acgme.org/ads>). The types of data that are accessible include: basic program information; participating site affiliations; current and past faculty and resident information; scholarly activity information for the current and most recent academic years; case log data; and milestones data. Rather, BMJ Case Reports publishes any case report that has a valuable clinical lesson, and it has a relatively high acceptance rate of around 40%. GMJ Case Reports particularly welcomes submissions from residents. The Shiffman Medical Library recently became an institutional fellow of BMJ Case Reports, which waives your individual fellowship fee. In other words, you can submit your case report to BMJ Case Reports for free! Simply contact Katherine Akers ([Katherine.akers@wayne.edu](mailto:Katherine.akers@wayne.edu)) before you submit your manuscript to obtain a fellowship code.





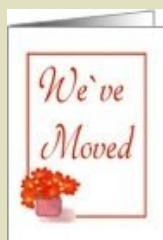
